Thomas F. McCloskey Sr., age 80 of Conshohocken, a retired supervisor, died on Wednesday, May 11th, 2011. He was born in Conshohocken on February 20th, 1931 son of the late Sara (McCloskey) Hadfield and step son of the late Joseph Hadfield. He was the beloved husband of Mary Ann Harvey for 60 years.
